### DIRECTIONS

Proper site preparation is important for a successful stand of wildflowers. Wildflowers can be planted early spring to late fall. Sunny, well-drained soil areas work best.

1. Best results will be obtained by planting wildflower seeds on loosened, cleared ground. Remove competition by raking and pulling out existing vegetation. Application of a non-selective herbicide to the area to be planted is one method of clearing away competing plants; follow manufacturer's label directions.
2. If possible, incorporating some organic material such as compost, peat moss or dehydrated manure into the upper soil surface will also improve poor soils and aid in water retention.

3. Seed may be sown by hand or a spreader and raked lightly into the soil. Water lightly for a few weeks until plants are established, gradually reducing the waterings. Have patience, flowers will take some time and TLC from Mother Nature!
  4. As wildflowers establish, remove undesirable weeds that may compete with germinating wildflowers by hand pulling or spraying proper weed controls. Flowers should appear in about 60 - 90 days.
- *Wildflowers can be mowed in late fall, after flowering to aid in re-establishing annual wildflower populations.*
